

Anne Guerrant (Gerr—ant) Bio

Anne Guerrant played tennis on the pro tour for nine years. She played at Wimbledon and the US Open, defeated Billie Jean King and Martina Navratilova, and ranked as high as #11 in the world.

During her tennis career she traveled all over the world and was humbled by the extreme poverty she saw in third world countries.

Anne and her husband, Terry, started the Guerrant Foundation to support programs that help the world's poorest people improve their lives through micro loans to start small businesses. To date they have helped over 18,000 people to start businesses. They take no salaries from their foundation and they match all donations up to \$100,000 per year. Anne is a donor, a fundraiser, and has her CLU and ChFC designations, having worked in life insurance and estate planning for several years.

On October 16 Anne Guerrant will also share a few photos and stories from her life on the tour to show you how she became motivated to take a leadership role in helping the world's poorest, and will give you some insights on philanthropy and fundraising. She will also tell you about the inspiring women she met in Nepal, India, Mexico, and Africa, where she saw micro credit lending programs first hand.
